Human Papillomavirus (HPV) is a common virus that causes 6 types of cancers in men and women including cervical, penile, vaginal, vulvar, anal, and throat cancer. Nearly all men and women get the virus at some point in their lives.

HPV-Related Cancers Are Increasing

• Throat (oropharyngeal) cancer caused by HPV is now 5 times higher in men than in women.



The Vaccine Works Best at Ages 9-12

HPV vaccination at this age
prevents most HPV-related
cancers and has led to a 62% drop
in cervical cancer deaths in the last
10 years.




Adults Up to Age 45 Can Benefit
