The purpose of the visit was to discuss the possibilities of the cooperation between Tashkent Medical Academy and University of Nebraska Medical Center and the University of Nebraska Omaha. The delegation met with researchers in the areas of genomic instability in cancer, molecular genetics of viral diseases, intracellular signaling mechanisms with potential collaborators, and leukemia and lymphoma.

During their one-week March spring break, six nursing students and two physical therapy students participated in a Student Alliance for Global Health (SAGH)-organized medical service trip, hosted by colleagues at the Universidad Anáhuac Veracruz (UAV), a partner institution of UNMC.
