
UNMC, Nebraska Medicine and the U.S. Air Force Research
Laboratory partner to establish the <u>Center for Sustainment</u>
of Trauma Readiness Skills (C-STARS) Omaha. C-STARS
Omaha focuses on advancing the readiness skills and
competency of U.S. Air Force medical personnel who
provide safe and effective care for patients who have
contracted or may have been exposed to highly hazardous
infectious diseases.

 The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services awarded funding to UNMC and Nebraska Medicine to develop a national <u>Training</u>, <u>Simulation and Quarantine Center (TSQC)</u>.



- UNMC's Dr. Edwin G. & Dorothy Balbach Davis Global Center, which houses the <u>Training</u>, <u>Simulation & Quarantine Center (TSQC)</u> with state-of-the-art quarantine facilities, clinical simulation infrastructure and training lab opened.
- UNMC and Nebraska Medicine established the Global Center for Health Security as the umbrella entity to oversee the entirety of its biopreparedness efforts. The Global Center for Health Security globally focuses on clinical care and operations, driving innovations in research and development, and training and education.
- Nebraska teamed up with <u>Emory University</u> in Atlanta and <u>Bellevue Hospital Center</u> in New York City, on a grant from the <u>U.S. Department of Health and Human Services</u> to establish and colead the nation's <u>National Ebola Training and Education Center</u>, now known as <u>National Emerging Special Pathogens Training and Education Center (NETEC)</u>.
