



UNMC Neuropsychology Fellowship

Overview

The University of Nebraska Medical Center offers a two-year post-doctoral fellowship in Clinical Neuropsychology under the Department of Neurological Sciences, Neuropsychology division. Training is based on the Houston Conference guidelines for specialty training in clinical neuropsychology. The Clinical Neuropsychology Fellowship Program is designed to fulfill the Nebraska state psychology licensure requirements and to ensure that trainees are prepared for future board certification in clinical neuropsychology. UNMC is a member of the Association of Postdoctoral Programs in Clinical Neuropsychology (APPCN) and participates in the APPCN match.

This fellowship position is located on the hospital's main campus in midtown Omaha, Nebraska. The Neuropsychology division staff includes four neuropsychologists, four psychometrists, a receptionist, and one neuropsychology fellow (with plan to recruit a second fellow in 2026).

Start Date

One adult-focused fellowship position will be available beginning in September 2025.

Length of Program

24 months

Anticipated Salary

\$61,000 / year with benefits

Benefits

- Comprehensive health, dental and vision insurance
- Basic life and disability insurance
- One day of sick leave accrued each month
- Twelve days of paid vacation are accrued, and 7 traditional holidays and 5 floating holidays are granted.
- Five days of leave with pay for approved professional or educational meetings
- \$2500 professional/conference fund (could be subject to change each year)

Clinical Training

Training is based on the Houston Conference guidelines for specialty training in clinical neuropsychology. Fellows will receive a minimum of two hours per week of individual face-to-face supervision with a clinical neuropsychologist. Fellows will have one 12-month rotation and two 6-month rotations which will account for 60 to 75% of fellowship activities.

- Rotation 1 (first 12 months): Presurgical and non-surgical epilepsy and movement disorders emphasis
- Rotation 2 (next 6 months): Presurgical and non-surgical neuro-oncology emphasis (with general neurology and memory disorders cases)
- Rotation 3 (last 6 months): General neurology and memory disorders

Research Opportunities

The program emphasizes clinical training with opportunity for clinical research. Research activities are typically accomplished within existing clinical research programs, with the expectation that the fellow will co-author at least one paper or poster during their two-year tenure.

Didactic Training Opportunities

Fellows will be expected to attend and participate in neuropsychology didactics including neuropsychology seminar, journal club, and group supervision series (boards prep, professional development discussions).

There are opportunities for additional educational programming offered through neurology and neurosciences, psychology, psychiatry, and neurosurgery.
