

# \*NEW Program Opportunity: Fall Risk **Screening Improvement Program for** Nebraska Rural Health Clinics

**Purpose:** to provide education, resources, and support for a cohort of RHCs to improve fall risk screening for older adults

**Timeline:** the Fall Risk Screening Improvement Program will run from January – June 2025 (6 months)

### **Program Activities**



#### **Baseline data** collection

to establish a baseline for % of older adult patients screened for fall risk

education regarding fall risk screening activities and implementation strategies

Future cohorts will focus on other specific fall risk management topics such as assessment and intervention of gait/strength/balance, medications, etc.

- Report changes made to fall risk screening practices
- Report a baseline and end of cohort % of older adult patients who are screened for fall risk in your clinic
