Opportunities may include a selection of the tasks listed below, based on student interest and organization priority:

- **Grants Management/Project Management:** Assist with end of fiscal year grant reporting and launch of a new federal grant year. Student will learn grant management, including investigating new grants, supporting completion of grant applications, and collecting data for grant reporting. (**In person Omaha**)
- **Program Evaluation:** Assist with communicating effectiveness of specific in-progress program activities, including programs that aim to increase access to medical care and with workforce training. (In person Omaha)
- Program Development: Partner with preceptor to develop, plan, and begin
 implementation of a selected grant activity to improve healthcare access. (In person Omaha)
- Applied Data Analysis & Visualization: Partner with preceptor to complete data-related projects around UDS or internal workflow/project data. May include tasks like data clean-up, parsing, visualization, interpretation, or tracking, using tools like power BI, python, asana, etc., from a programs perspective or an advocacy lens. (In person Omaha)
- **Health Education:** Support health education projects related to behavioral health and/or maternal health. (In person Omaha)

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- Emergency Management: Support the health centers in this space by preparing resources, creating audit tools, creating drill forms. Develop a resource and capacity log which health centers have mobile units, portable generators, other items they could share and what organizations a health center should connect with if they have an emergency heart to heart, Region 7 Emergency prep group, UNMC CEPRS, etc. (In person Omaha)
- Welcome to Health Center Medicine: Partner with our on-staff Nurse Practitioner to create education for providers/clinicians new to the FQHC world. Including tips on what to set up in your NextGen HER, the importance of documentation and coding accuracy, being selective in ordering patterns (meds, labs, and DI) to minimize cost (VBC adjacent), and how NE health center funding works (HRSA, Medicaid, payer mix). (Must have clinical background or be enrolled in other clinical training, potential hybrid/remote option Omaha)
