








Outdoor Safety

Watch for changing weather conditions



Hearing Hazards

- If you cannot lower the volume, move away from the noise
- If you cannot lower the volume or move away, you should wear hearing protection



Hearing loss can happen over time and it is permanent! It is better to be safe than sorry - wear ear protection around loud noises.

Electrical Safety



PTO Safety


A Power Take-Off (PTO) shaft is the spinning part that runs between the tractor and another piece of equipment, like an auger or baler. A PTO brings power to the other piece of equipment.




- Never climb over or touch a PTO, even if it has a shield
- Never wear jewelry or loose clothing and be sure to tie back long hair to prevent getting caught in the PTO

Tractor Safety



Equipment that travels under 30 mph requires a visible slow-moving vehicle sign when using the road. Color in the sign above.






Remember:

- Tractors are not designed to carry passengers one seat, one rider
- Do not sit on the wheel covers of a tractor
- Always make sure the tractor driver can see you
- Stay away from hydraulic hoses on the tractor and spinning parts

Grain Bin Safety



Find your way through the grain bin maze

- Lots of stored grain places, like grain bins, wagons, or silos might look fun to play in, but they can be very dangerous. When there is a lot of grain in one place, it can move like water.
- When someone gets trapped in grain, it acts like quicksand it can quickly become hard to escape the grain pile on your own.

Cell phones don't always work in a steel bin, so it's important to not rely only on a phone if something happens.




AND REMEMBER... STAY OUT OF GRAIN BINS!

When you are riding on an ATV or UTV, it is important to wear proper gear which includes a helmet, safety goggles, long sleeve shirt, pants, boots, and gloves to prevent injuries. Follow the key to color the ATV and UTV safety gear.

Dos & Don'ts of Safe ATV & UTV riding

- · DO ride an ATV that is right for your age and size
- DON'T carry a passenger on a single-rider ATV
- DO ride on designated trails
- DON'T ride after dark
- DO drive at a safe speed
- · DO wear a seatbelt in a UTV





It is important to not ride on paved roads because another vehicle could hit you, and ATVs are not made to be driven on highways or hard-surface roads.

& Mower Safety


To be safe around skidsteers and lawn mowers:

- · You should be able to reach the controls on a mower and skid steer while wearing a seatbelt
- NEVER ride on a mower with a passenger
- NEVER approach a skid steer while it is in use

Animals can be unpredictable, especially when they get scared.


It is important to know when an animal is scared or in pain to protect yourself and the animal.

Most animals on the farm have blind spots, which means when you are standing in that area, the animal cannot see you.

When working with animals, remember to BE CALM, MOVE SLOWLY, AND AVOID LOUD NOISES.



Working with Cows


Cows can get very big and can move quickly. It is important to be quiet and move slowly so you don't scare the cow.

Cows and other big animals kick when they get scared, so it is important to not stand behind them. Cows have good memories and can learn guickly.

Working with Pigs

Pigs do not get as big as cows, but they can still be unpredictable. Pigs can get scared easily.

Pigs cannot see right behind them, have sensitive hearing, and like to be with other pigs when being moved.








