Description of partner organization's priority opportunities (APEx activities):

- Actively participate with the Tobacco Prevention and Education team and the Tobacco Free Lancaster County coalition, the student will attend meetings regularly, providing updates on their progress.
- The student will collect data and insights on tobacco use within the LGBTQIA+ community, developing strategies to obtain this information when it's not readily available.
- Using the gathered data, the student will create engaging informational materials targeted at the LGBTQIA+ community, such as brochures and handouts. These resources will support the efforts of the Tobacco Prevention and Education team, OutNebraska, and local agencies serving the LGBTQIA+ population.
- The student will also lead the organization and facilitation of the coalition's involvement in the Star City Pride parade and festival, including designing promotional materials, planning outreach and booth activities, and managing the event's logistics. While the Tobacco Prevention and Education team will provide assistance, the student will spearhead the project, ensuring everything from booth design to staffing is well-organized for the events on June 7 and 8, 2024.

Benefit of proposed activities to partner organization:

The proposed project benefits the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department Tobacco Prevention and Education team and Tobacco Free Lancaster County by providing effective outreach in the LGBTQIA+ community. Individuals in the LGBTQIA+ community are at

Moreover, leading the involvement in local events like the Star City Pride parade provides a unique opportunity to increase visibility, promote health equity, and foster community engagement. These efforts align with the department's mission to promote public health and create tobacco-free environments, leveraging the student's contributions to advance these goals.

Benefit of proposed activities to the student:
