

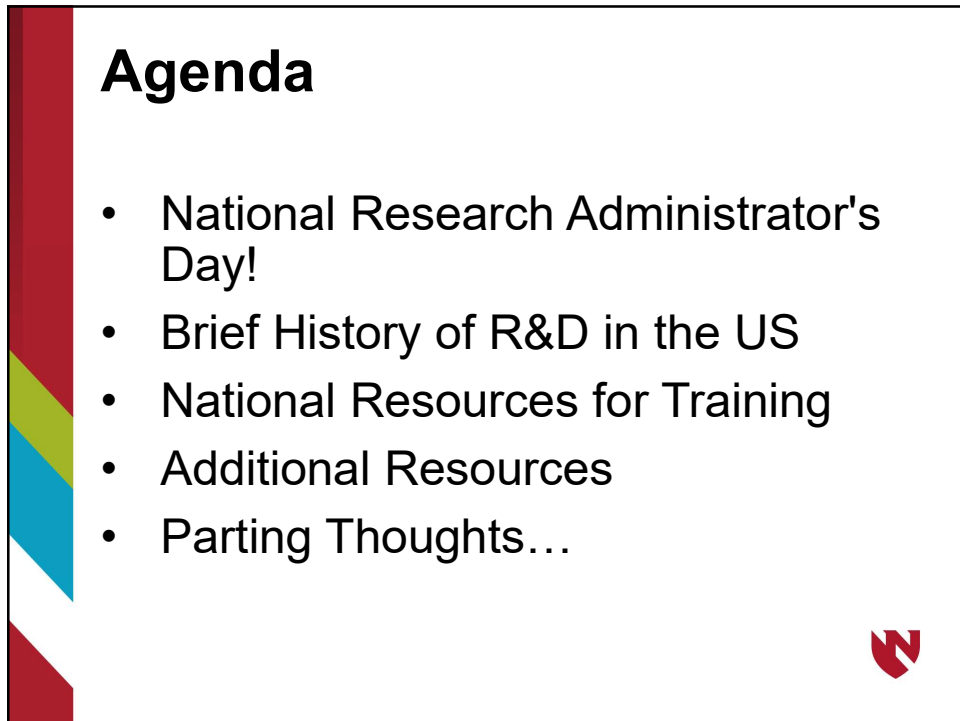

# Brief History of Research in America

- 
- Research has been supported by the US government essentially since its inception, Examples include:
    - Smithsonian (1846)
    - Morrell Act (1862)
    - National Academy of Sciences (1863)
    - Marine Hospital Service (1798)
  - The Marine Hospital Service eventually became the Public Health Service (PHS) in 1912.

- 
- Research within the US didn't really start to take its current form until the 1940's.
  - President Franklin Roosevelt's creation of a federal agency – the National Defense Research Council in 1940.
    - Initially charged with coordination between Federal and Private Research Labs.

- Results in the Office of Scientific Research and Development Report - *Science The Endless Frontier* (July 25, 1945)
- Instrumental in the creation of the National Science Foundation.

## 5 Basic principles which underlie the program of Government support for scientific research and education:

- (1) There must be stability of funds over a period of years so that long-range programs may be undertaken.
- (2) The agency to administer such funds should be composed of citizens of broad interest in and understanding of the peculiarities of scientific research and education.
- (3) The agency should promote research through contracts or grants to organizations outside the Federal Government. It should not operate any laboratories of its own.
- (4) Support of basic research in the public and private colleges, universities, and research institutes must leave the internal control of policy, personnel, and the method and scope of the research to the institutions themselves. This is of the utmost importance.
- (5) While assuring complete independence and freedom for the nature, scope, and methodology of research carried on in the institutions receiving public funds, and while retaining discretion in the allocation of funds among such institutions.



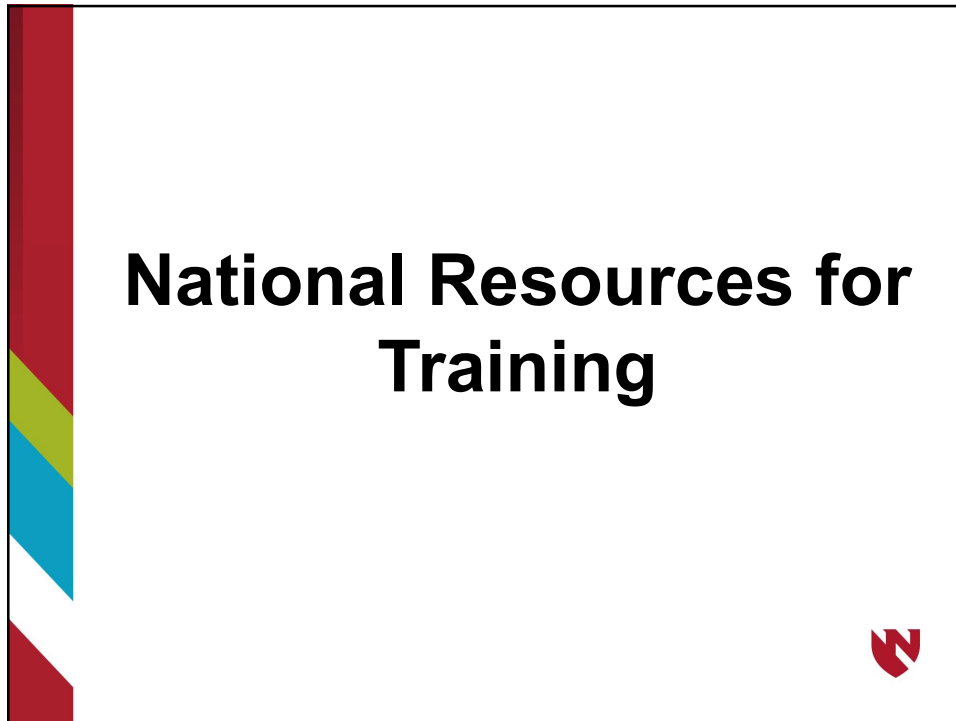

## So why the background?

- Prior to WWII federal research funding was happening but it was not coordinated and spotty at best.
- Research programs were generally managed by the researchers themselves.
- After the war research funding continually increased in \$ and scope.
- This expansion effectively lent to the creation of the Research Administration field.

## National Council of University Research Administrators (NCURA)

- Initiated in 1958.
- Conducts an annual meeting (August), historically held in Washington DC.
- Conducts workshops (virtual and in-person) covering Auditing, Contracting, Dept RA, Financial RA, SPA I, SPA II (and more)
- 8 Geographic regions also hold annual meetings
  - Region IV is holding its Spring Meeting May 4-7 2025 in Chicago
  - Mentorship Program, Career Path Pilot, and Traveling workshops

## Society of Research Administrators International (SRAI)

- Initiated in 1967
- Conducts an annual meeting (October), historically held in rotating locations in the US and abroad.
  - 2024 Annual Meeting being held October 26-28 in Chicago.
- Conducts workshops (virtual and in-person) covering Financial Management, SP Admin, Intensives in several topic areas, Micro-Credential sessions (and more)
- 6 Geographic Sections also hold annual meetings
  - Midwest and Western Sections are holding a joint meeting March 26-18, 2025 in Colorado Springs

## Federal Demonstration Partnership (FDP)

- Initiated in 1986 initially as the Florida Demonstration Project with (5 Federal Agencies, the Florida State University System and the University of Miami)
- Phase II began 1988 – 1996 opening to schools outside of Florida and the name changed to **Federal Demonstration Partnership**.
- Three meetings per year (all in Washington DC)
- Currently in Phase VII ending Jan 2027
- UNMC is currently participating in the FDP Expanded Clearinghouse

### University Industry Demonstration Partnership (UIDP)

- Launched in 2006 by the National Academies following two meetings assessing University and Industry interest (2004 in San Francisco, CA; and 2005 in Winter Park, CO)
- 2006 – 2015 meetings were held in Washington, DC two times per year.
- In 2015 spun out of the Academies and formed as an independent organization.
- Provides to Industry and University members projects and recourses in the same manor that FDP does for Federal and University members.

## Council on Governmental Relations (COGR)

- Formed in 1948
- Currently has 220 research institutions as members to include leading research universities, medical centers, and independent research institutes.
- COGR communicates the viewpoint and concerns of its members and fosters productive relationships between the research community and federal policymakers, advocating for innovation and change that avoid unnecessary regulatory burden.
- UNMC is currently not a member institution, but we are looking to potentially join.

## Cohort for Efficiencies in Research Administration (CERA)

- Formed by Senior Research Leaders at Yale, New York University, and University of Texas at Arlington
- Seeks to establish industry standards for institutions to effectively and efficiently implement and comply with the regulations that govern sponsored research.

## WCG<sup>tm</sup> (Western IRB – Copernicus Group)

- Western Institutional Review Board (WIRB) was formed in 1968.
  - WIRB is established three years before the National Institutes of Health (NIH) required ethics review of human research.
- Copernicus Group Independent Review Board formed in 1996.
  - Eventually become the leading provider of independent IRB services to research sponsors and contract research organizations.
- WIRB and Copernicus merge in 2012.
